

St Patrick's Classical School Transition Year Information Pack 3rd Year Parents

What is Transition Year?

Transition Year is an optional one year, school based programme between Junior Cycle and Senior Cycle. It is designed to act as a bridge between the two by facilitating the smooth transition from the more dependent learning of the Junior Cycle to the more independent, self directed learning required for the Senior Cycle.

In St Patrick's, Transition Year offers students an opportunity to engage in independent, self directed learning, to develop general, technical and academic skills, and to mature and develop without the pressure of an examination.

Students get the opportunity to sample a wide range of subject areas and can make more informed choices about the kind of Leaving certificate programme they want to follow after the Transition Year.

What are the main benefits of completing the Transition Year Programme?

Academic Advantages	Studies show TY Students score 50 CAO points more on average and a higher percentage go on to study at 3rd level. TY enables students to take a greater responsibility for their own learning and decision making.
Career and Work Experience	Gives Students time to explore different career options and then to pursue work experience in these areas. Students also get interview experience, learn to write CV's and get the opportunity to sample 3rd Level Courses.
Self Confidence and Leadership	Students undertake multiple leadership courses and activities. They also get the opportunity to work with younger classes, which develops confidence in public speaking
Certification	Over the course of the year, students complete various certifiable courses and are encouraged to achieve the GAISCE presidents award. These will bolster CV and college applications
Personal Development	TY promotes students' time management and their ability to work independently amongst many others.
Social Contribution	Students undertake various volunteering opportunities with organisations such as SVP and Beaufort House. They also run an annual fundraiser for charities such as Focus Ireland and Barretstown.

Work Experience

Students have a weekly Careers class where they get to explore and investigate potential careers as well as develop skills and competencies that will allow them to maximise potential opportunities. They learn how to write CVs and over the course of the year, get various opportunities in Interview settings, and receive feedback from these.

Students are expected to complete 2 seperate week long Work Experience placements in areas that are of interest to them. Students are required to secure their own placements. This will usually take place in the 2 weeks prior to the Easter Holidays. Students will be assigned a Work Experience Mentor who will guide them through the process and also ensure that relevant evaluations have been completed.

Students may apply for leave for additional work experience if there is sufficient educational benefits (maximum 2 extra weeks) and parents must contact the coordinator to ensure that this does not clash with essential programme activities.

They also get to learn about and sample subjects that they may wish to take at senior cycle level.

How is Transition Year Assessed and Reported on?

Transition year students will be assessed continuously over the year, using a credit based system. The rationale for this is as follows:

- It will increase student accountability
- It will reward the students who engage most with the programme
- It will provide a slightly more academic focus, ensuring students can integrate more easily back into 5th year.

Each Teacher would be responsible for devising how they wish to allocate credits (Exams/Individual or Group Projects/Pass/Fail Basis). Core Subjects would be encouraged to use a common assessment.

Fees For the Transition Year Programme

The Fees for the Transition Year Programme in St Pats will be confirmed at the next Board of Management Meeting and communicated to you in the event that your son is offered a place in Transition Year. The fee is likely to be €400. A Deposit of €200 must be paid at the time of acceptance and the balance must be paid in full (installments are accepted) before the 1st September.

Any Foreign Trips will be paid in addition to the Transition Year Fee

Filling Out the Application Form

The information supplied on the application form will be used as part of the success criteria for the selection of successful candidates. Other criteria (as per the Transition Year Admissions policy available on the school website) will be:

- The student's disciplinary record
- The student's attendance and punctuality record
- The recommendation of the Transition Year Coordinator following consultation with subject teachers, Class Tutors, Year Head and school management

Information from the students' school journal (positive comments/misbehaviour) will be used as evidence to support this application. Students will be scored in accordance with the selection criteria and those who receive the highest score will be offered a place in transition year. A waiting list will be drawn up in the event that successful candidates do not take up their place.

A student's place is secured upon the receipt of a letter of acceptance and a deposit of €200, payable to the school office. The remainder of the Transition Year Fees must be paid in full or in installments in advance of the 1st September in order for the students' place to remain secure.
